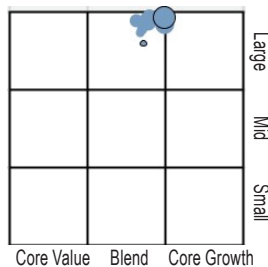

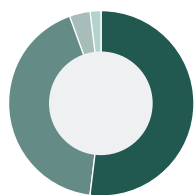

AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2023

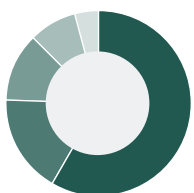

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The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.

The Blended Index is comprised of a 25% weighting in the VettaFi US Equity Large/Mid-Cap 1000 Total Return Index (designed to track the 1000 largest US stocks), a 25% weighting in the VettaFi US Equity Small-Cap 2000 Total Return Index (designed to track the 1001st through 3000th largest US stocks), and a 50% weighting in the Bloomberg U.S. Intermediate Government/Credit Bond Index (an unmanaged index generally representative of intermediate term bonds). Prior to 5/1/23 the blended benchmark had consisted of 25% weighting in the Russell 1000® Index (an index of approximately 1,000 of the largest companies in the U.S. equity market.), a 25% weighting in the Russell 2000® Index (a widely recognized index of market activity based on the aggregate performance of U.S. domiciled, publicly traded common stocks) and a 50% weighting in the Bloomberg U.S. Intermediate Government/Credit Bond Index (an unmanaged index generally representative of intermediate term bonds). Price/Earnings ratio is a valuation of a company's current share price compared to its per-share earnings. Price/Book ratio is a ratio used to compare a stock's market value to its book value.
